ACADEMICS

By integrating remedial instruction with early career exploration, our students embark on their journey as career explorers from a young age. Our curriculum prioritizes practical academics, with a strong emphasis on reading, writing, mathematics, & science. Following high school, students can transition into the Vocational Center through an IEP team approval process.

Career Technical Training

Our Career Technical Training program offers specialized vocational and career education through six career academies in a unique collaboration with two local junior colleges. In high school, students engage in on-site work experiences to practice and showcase their growing skills. Students in the Bridgeport Vocational Center experience maximum community integration through off-site work opportunities.

Social Skills

Effective social skills are essential in various life contexts, including the workplace, at home, within the community, and among friends. We place a strong emphasis on modeling and teaching social skills in our daily classes.

At Bridgeport School and Bridgeport Vocational Center, we recognize the unique challenges our students face while celebrating their diverse interests, talents, and strengths. Our program places an emphasis on Career Technical Education (CTE), offering students a well-structured path toward lifelong independence and self-fulfillment. Our curriculum is built around career-focused, project-based instruction, providing valuable skills and insights from elementary to high school and throughout the transition program. After graduating from high school, students can move on to the Bridgeport Vocational Center where students can explore various pathways and employment opportunities within their chosen CTE fields. Students benefit from hands-on learning experiences through rotating internships with local businesses, including Petco, Van Nuys Library, Sharky's, and more.

Applications are accepted year-round for students ages 5 to 22.
